Hundred Club Q&A

What's it all about?

The purpose of the '100' Club is to raise funds for local initiatives, other charities and any organisation or group that would benefit from a contribution from the Club It is not a new idea by any means- many organisations have a Hundred club

Why is it called the Hundred Club

There is no sensible answer to that one- it can have as many members as you like

How does it work? It works very simply. Members pledge £48 p.a, payable quarterly by standing order, in return for one number - £4 placed in monthly draws. The prizes will be paid monthly from a fund which is 50% of the monthly 'pot'. There will be 3 prizes made up of 50%, 30% and 20% of the prize pot. So if there are 100 members, £200 would be retained and £200 distributed-at £100 for the winner, £60 for second and £40 for third. The bigger the membership, the bigger the prizes. Each member is allocated a permanent number in the monthly draw. This number shall remain the member's provided their subscription is up to date.

Can I only have one number?

No – you can have as many as you like. Also wives, partners, friends and relatives are very welcome to take part

Will the proceeds be separate from the main choir accounts?

Yes. A new bank account has been opened specifically for the Hundred Club as a separate entity, and every penny raised will be lodged in it. There will be no administration costs to deduct apart from bank charges and minimal set up costs

Who will run it?

Three administrators who will be Hundred Club members.. The Administrators will sanction the use of funds raised after consultation and the agreement of the Hundred Club members

How do I join?

It's simple. Set up a standard order with your bank for quarterly payment- (or pay an annual subscription up front if you prefer), and inform an administrator when you have done so. He will register you as a Hundred Club member and allocate you a number to be entered in the next available draw.
